Tiffany Alberts convicted of injecting feces into son's IV

Alberts found guilty of six counts of Aggravated Battery

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind. — Marion County Prosecutor Ryan Mears announced today that Tiffany Alberts has been convicted of six counts of Aggravated Battery (Level 3 Felonies) for injecting her 15-year-old son's IV with fecal matter while he was undergoing cancer treatments. In November 2016, Alberts was charged with several counts after an investigation revealed she was injecting her son's IV with feces causing her son bacterial infections and sepsis.

In 2016, Albert's son returned to the hospital with multiple bacterial infections one week after completing his first cancer treatment. At that time, it was unknown what was causing a blood infection. After extensive evaluation there was no medical reason to explain the ongoing blood infection.

Once the patient was placed in a room with video surveillance, hospital staff discovered Alberts using a syringe and injecting an unknown substance in her child's IV bag. Initially Alberts told investigators she was injecting water into the IV line before admitting to injecting fecal matter into her son's IV bag.

A Sentencing Hearing for Alberts has been set for Dec. 6 at 2:00 p.m. in Criminal Court 5.
